At Wentzville’s Board of Aldermen meeting on Wednesday, June 22, the Board approved the Mayor’s appointment of David Gipson as the new City Administrator. Gipson has served as the Acting City Administrator following former City Administrator Robert Bartolotta’s retirement in February.



The City Administrator is responsible for carrying out the policies and ordinances of the Board of Aldermen; overseeing the day-to-day operations of the government; appointing and supervising the heads of the various City departments; and serving as the chief administrative assistant to the Mayor. In this role, the City Administrator has superintending control of the administration and management of the government business, officers and employees of the City, subject to the direction and supervision of the Mayor.

Prior to his appointment as Wentzville’s Assistant City Administrator in March 2015, Gipson served as Assistant City Manager for the City of Richmond Heights, Mo. Previously, he worked for the City of St. Charles, Mo., in various capacities from 2004 to 2011 – serving as planner, government relations specialist and the planning manager.

Gipson holds a bachelor’s degree in Planning from Missouri State University in Springfield and a master’s degree in public policy administration from the University of Missouri-St. Louis, with an emphasis in local government management.
