A FREE pickup for tree and shrub trimmings will occur on October 3-7 for residents living **north** of the railroad tracks and October 11-14 for residents living **south** of the railroad tracks. Trimmings should be at the curb by 6am on Monday of the scheduled pickup week. The lengths of the branches is not a factor, however the largest branch that will be accepted must be no larger than 8" in diameter.

Please do not tie branches together or place in yard bags. The Chipper program is strictly for limbs and branches. Leaves or other yard waste materials will not be accepted.
